- # From 1994 to 2000, there were two leagues (Commonwealth League and Freedom League). The regular-season champion and No. 1 from each league squared off against the No. 2 seed from the other league and the winners then played for the MAC Title. (4-team playoff double elimination)
- % From 1981 to 1993, there were two divisions and four leagues (Northern Division: Northeast/Northwest Leauges & Southern Division: Southeast/Southwest Leagues). The regular-season champion from each league squared off of in a one-game playoff for the Division Title. The two divisional champions then played for the MAC Title.
- & In 1980, the first year of conerence play, there was two divisions (Northern and Southern). The two divisional regular-season champions played a championship game for the overall MAC Title
